Black Earth, WI

Real estate in the village of Black Earth is situated 20 miles west of Madison, and surrounded by public hunting land and Black Earth Creek. The properties here can include several acres of land and offer opportunities for country living. Bungalows and ranches are common, and screened in porches are frequently features of the homes here. Both affordable and high-end properties are available in the area. Several historic homes are situated near downtown, and within walking distance to the library, historical museum, and local businesses.



Area Parks & Events

Hunting and fishing are popular activities in and around Black Earth. The village is home to Black Earth Creek, a class 1 trout stream. The stream is recognized as one of the 100 best trout fishing streams in North America. In addition, 17,000 acres of public hunting land surround the village. Other popular outdoor opportunities include the nearby Ice Age Trail, and a variety of bike riding routes, including the Horribly Hilly Hundreds bike race, which includes a stop in Black Earth. The chamber of commerce sponsors concerts in the park weekly in June and July. August offers the annual Field Days, a weekend of family oriented activities, kickball tournaments, and live music.



Schools

Black Earth properties are zoned to the Wisconsin Heights School District, which includes schools and facilities in both Black Earth and Mazomanie. The district houses PreK-2nd grade in Black Earth, and 3rd-5th grades in Mazomanie. The middle and high schools are located on property between the two villages.
